This is not a complete list of crimes, but a guide for neighbourhood watch coordinators and other community members to be aware of crime trends and to pass this information onto their scheme members, so that necessary crime reduction techniques can be applied.

Below I have listed details of local burglaries as this has been the area of most concern.

The national website www.police.uk will give access to crime figures around your specified locality.

Burglary Dwelling

Reddings Park – Overnight entry via an unlocked UPVC window. Items stolen.

St Lukes Road – Overnight, a sash window forced, entry gained and items stolen..

Burglary Non Dwelling

Old Bath Road – Afternoon of 1st March offender was disturbed by homeowner trying to break into shed, offender made off and later one male arrested by police.

Other crime of note

Greenhills Road – Afternoon, unlocked pushbike visible from the road, stolen from car port.

Canterbury Walk – Wooden bench stolen from garden.

Sandhurst Road – Car window smashed with a brick.

Haywards Road – Pushbike which was locked to a lamppost stolen.

Andover Street – attempt made to cut a lock on pushbike secured to a fence.

- During the last few weeks, PCSO Benbow who is youth lead officer, has been attending numerous schools and undertaking both educational lessons and tag rugby training.
- Liaison with mental health crisis team concerning, an adult who was then sectioned and ensuring care procedures were in place relating to family members.
- Meetings relating to the Charlton Kings and Battledown Neighbourhood forum.
- Planning relating to race week. In addition to the force wide response, the local team will be undertaking local patrols and also ensuring crime prevention messages are distributed to local premises, including hotels, restaurants and licensed premises. The team will also be distributing bottled water, secured from a drinks company. The nightclubs will then provide these as people leave the clubs.

Come and visit your local police team on Friday 9th March 2012 between 1pm and 7pm near to Televid, Bath Road, Cheltenham.

Also present will be Cheltenham Borough Council officers, including the Community Protection officers and enforcement officers.
Neighbourhood watch will be in attendance.

The surgery continues in the foyer of the Municipal Offices in the Promenade between 10.30am and 12.30pm, Monday to Friday. This enables you to attend and discuss issues relating to both policing and Cheltenham borough council services at the same time.
