Our Policing Pledge

- 1 We will always treat you fairly with dignity and respect.
- 2 We will make sure you know how to contact, and work with, your dedicated Safer Community Team.
- 3 Those teams will be visibly working with you 80 per cent of their time.
- 4 The Safer Community Team will get back to you within 24 hours of your contact and where necessary, we will provide a more detailed response as soon as possible.
- 5 We aim to answer 999 calls within 10 seconds, and we will get to emergencies as soon as we can safely do so. We aim to reach you within 15 minutes in urban areas, and 20 minutes in rural areas.
- 6 If you are calling about an issue that is an agreed neighbourhood priority, and attendance is required, we will aim to be with you within an hour. Alternatively we will make an appointment within 48 hours of your call, or we will provide you with advice, answer questions or put you in touch with someone who can help.
- 7 We will arrange public meetings to agree your priorities, at least once a month, giving you a chance to meet your local policing team with other members of your community.
- 8 We will provide you with monthly updates on progress, and on local crime and policing issues.
- 9 If you have been a victim of crime and you would like us to visit, we will do so. We will agree how often you want information on how the case is progressing – it could be every month.
- 10 If you are not happy with our service, we will work with you to resolve things.

Policing Priorities

Within each Safer Community Team there are a number of smaller communities. Each community is able to put in place a series of priorities to address community needs through Neighbourhood Coordination Group meetings (sometimes referred to as panel meetings), which are held every two to three months.

Most of these meetings are chaired by the local partnership and attended by representatives from the police; local authority; local councillors; housing associations; education; members of the local community and any other interested parties including the local press.

As well as setting the community priorities for each area, this group is responsible for deciding how to address each priority and who should take the lead for each one – the police are not always the lead agency. The group are also responsible for deciding if a priority has been successfully addressed and dealt with and whether or not to sign it off.

All the agencies involved in this process undertake regular community consultations to make sure that the views of as many people from each community as possible are represented at each meeting.

We also welcome views sent by e-mail for those who have access, at stroud-sct@gloucestershire.police.uk. The dates and venues for each meeting are publicised on our Safer Community Team website, in the local press and on posters displayed at key points.

Stroud Safer Community Team Priorities November 2009 – January 2010

Stroud Rural Community

Speeding vehicles in Bisley.

A number of speed checks have been conducted and a two week speed survey has also been carried out.

Anti-social behaviour in the vicinity of Old Neighbourhood Chalford.

Local police and PCSOs have conducted high visibility patrols in the area. We ensure that anyone involved in anti-social behaviour is advised on their behaviour.

Criminal Damage at Painswick Golf Course.

Active patrols of the area have been conducted to reduce the reports of criminal damage.

Stroud Urban Community

Anti-social behaviour and underage drinking on Elm Road playing fields during Friday and Saturday evenings.

Proactive and high visibility patrols in the area of Elm Road have been conducted to reduce anti-social behaviour in the area. Any alcohol found in possession of young people is seized and their parents are informed.

Anti-social behaviour and underage drinking in Stratford Park during Friday and Saturday evenings.

Local officers have conducted high visibility patrols in the area and anyone found in possession of alcohol has been issued with advice. Anti-social behaviour regarding vehicles has been one of the priorities and we have spoken to those people using the car park as a meeting place.

Street drinking by Stroud Subscription Rooms.

Proactive patrols have been conducted within the area resulting in alcohol being seized and an arrest for an alcohol-related offence. A multi-agency meeting has taken place to look at medium to long term solutions to the issues.
