Gloucestershire Constabulary Freedom of Information request 2023.0402

On 13/04/2023 you sent an email constituting a request under the Freedom of Information Act asking the following:

Theft of Used Cooking Oil is increasing.

When this oil is seized by your by your service, can you please let me know what happens to it?

The most sustainable use of Used Cooking Oil is to recover it into biodiesel and therefore the best use of seized Used Cooking Oil is to have it collected (by accredited waste carriers) and used to manufacture biodiesel.

My company would be very interested in providing this service, but would need to know what current process you have.

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 s1, I can confirm that Gloucestershire Constabulary holds some relevant information.

Gloucestershire Constabulary seizes very few items such as used cooking oil. As such, if a seizure is made it is disposed of via our contracted waste services.

If you are not satisfied with this response or any actions taken in dealing with your request, you have the right to ask that we review your case under our internal procedure. Please note that a request for an internal review must be made within 20 working days of the response to your original request.

If you decide to request that such a review is undertaken and following this process you are still unsatisfied, you then have the right to direct your complaint to the Information Commissioner for consideration.
