



Dear **Gloucestershire Constabulary Freedom of Information request 2023.0288**

On 08/03/2023 you sent an email constituting a request under the Freedom of Information Act asking the following:

I am writing to request the following information:

1. The number of requests for the deletion of images in your custody image database received by your force in 2020, 2021 and 2022 [provided separately please]
2. The number of these requests that were agreed to by your force, in each of those years.
3. A copy of any leaflet or information provided to arrestees by your force "explaining their rights to have their custody image deleted under certain circumstances", and any document/guidance given to officers on when to make this information available to arrestees.

NB as rights of erasure are requests made pursuant or in relation to GDPR rights, I note that the ICO guidance states that records of these requests and outcomes should be kept, suggesting that these records should be accessible.

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 s1, I can confirm that Gloucestershire Constabulary holds some relevant information.
