Gloucestershire Constabulary Freedom of Information request FOI_24_0313

On 13/03/2024 you sent an email constituting a request under the Freedom of Information Act asking the following:

1. How many incidents of illegal dumping of rubbish (also commonly known as fly dumping or fly tipping) occurred within the jurisdiction of your force's authority last year (i.e. 2023)
2. How many incidents of illegal dumping of rubbish (also commonly known as fly dumping or fly tipping) occurred within the jurisdiction of your force's authority have occurred since the beginning of 2024?
3. How many arrests were made by your police force for illegal dumping of rubbish (also commonly known as fly dumping or fly tipping) last year (i.e. 2023)
4. How many arrests were made by your police force for illegal dumping of rubbish (also commonly known as fly dumping or fly tipping) since the beginning of 2024

I have reformatted your questions for ease.

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 s1, I can confirm that Gloucestershire Constabulary holds no relevant information.

The Constabulary does not record reported incidents of fly tipping as it is not something that the police deal with.

Members of the public wanting to report fly tipping would be referred to the local council to where the problem has arisen.
