1) Please provide contact details for your Force Crime Registrar

2) Please find attached "DRINK AND DRUG DRIVING POLICY" from Norfolk Constabulary and Suffolk Constabulary. Please may you provide your equivalent policy or procedure on the subject

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 s1, I can confirm that Gloucestershire Constabulary holds some relevant information.

1) The ACPO minimum standards for all police force publication schemes is that we must provide a non-emergency number and an e-mail address for general enquiries.
