Gloucestershire Constabulary Freedom of Information request 25_0955

On 01/10/2025 you sent an email constituting a request under the Freedom of Information Act asking the following:

Q1 How many instances of parcel theft from a doorstep have been reported between the following dates:

01/10/2024-30/09/2025

01/10/2023-30/09/2024

01/10/2022-30/09/2023

01/10/2021-30/09/2022

01/10/2020-30/09/2021

Q2. If possible, can you share the number of reported instances of parcel theft from a doorstep for each month for each of the date ranges in question one. If too time consuming, please would you provide it for the most recent date range.

Q3. If possible, can you share what type of product were stolen most (E.G. mobile phone, air fryer) for the date ranges provided in question one.

Q4. If possible, can you share the total reported value of stolen parcels for the date ranges provided in question one.

Q6. If possible, can you share any data that you hold on which postal or parcel carrier delivered the parcels to the doorsteps of the incidents reported for each of the date ranges in question one.

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 s1, I can confirm that Gloucestershire Constabulary holds some relevant information.

Section 17 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 requires Gloucestershire Constabulary, when refusing to provide information (because the information is exempt) to provide you the applicant with a notice which: (a) states the fact, (b) specifies the exemption in question and (c) states (if not otherwise apparent) why the exemption applies.

The following exemptions apply:

Section 21 – Information reasonably accessible by other means

The above exemption is absolute and class-based and therefore no Public Interest Test or Harm Test is required.

The information that you have requested is already reasonably accessible to you by other means and is therefore exempt by virtue of Section 21 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000. Gloucestershire Constabulary are required to make certain information available to the public as part of a publication scheme.

If you are not satisfied with this response or any actions taken in dealing with your request, you have the right to ask that we review your case under our internal procedure. Please note that a request for an internal review must be made within 20 working days of the response to your original request.

If you decide to request that such a review is undertaken and following this process you are still unsatisfied, you then have the right to direct your complaint to the Information Commissioner for consideration.
