Gloucestershire Constabulary Freedom of Information request FOI_26_0349

On 02/04/2026 you sent an email constituting a request under the Freedom of Information Act asking the following:

Thank you for your response dated 02 April 2026 regarding request reference FOI_26_0320, and for your advice under Section 16 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

If you are able to review an amended request, please see below.

In light of your guidance, I would like to refine my request so that it may fall within the cost limits set out under Section 12:

For the period 1 January 2025 to 31 December 2025 (including start and end dates), please provide the total number of incident records within the following offence categories, or equivalent offence codes used by your force:

- rape
- sexual assault
- assault by penetration
- administering a substance with intent
- any other sexual offence code considered relevant

only where the modus operandi (MO), summary, or associated free-text crime record contains any of the following terms:

“vape”, “vaping”, “e-cig”, “e-cigarette”, “electronic cigarette”

and where the same record also contains terms such as:

We are committed to being an anti-discriminatory organisation. This means not only acting in a non-discriminatory way, but addressing systemic inequalities, disadvantage and discrimination.

“spike”, “spiking”, “drugged”, “drugging”, “administered substance”, or “incapacitated”.

If possible, please also provide the search terms and offence codes used to identify the records. Should incident records prove to be too vast then please provide the total number of recorded crimes (rather than all incident records).

For clarity, I am seeking the aggregate number of incidents/crimes only and do not require any narrative details or case-specific information beyond what can be identified through an electronic search of offence-coded records.

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 s1, I can confirm that Gloucestershire Constabulary may hold some relevant information.

Following receipt of your request, a free-text search of incident records was conducted for the keyword “electronic” and 3106 results were returned for the time frame requested. The only way of trying to determine whether any relevant information is held and to retrieve that information would be to manually review each incident. This would involve the review of hundreds of records and would therefore take far longer than the 18 hours prescribed by the Freedom of Information Act.

Please see below for suggestions on how you may be able to refine your request to come within the cost constraints of Section 12 of the Act.

Section 17(5) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 requires Gloucestershire Constabulary, when refusing to provide information (because the information is exempt) to provide you the applicant with a notice which: (a) states the fact, (b) specifies the exemption in question and (c) states (if not otherwise apparent) why the exemption applies.

In relation to your request Section 12 applies.

Section 12(1) – Fee Regulations states:

Section 1(1) of the Act does not oblige a public authority to comply with a request for information if the authority estimates that the cost of complying with the request would exceed the appropriate limit. (As detailed in the Data Protection and Freedom of Information Fees Regulations of 2004)

The appropriate limit at the moment is £450 calculated at an hourly rate of £25 per hour for all staff time incurred in:

- i. Determining whether information is held
- ii. Locating it
- iii. Retrieving it
- iv. Extracting the information to be disclosed from the other information.

In accordance with the Act, this letter represents a Refusal Notice for your request.

Section 16 – duty to assist

It may be possible to conduct a search of substantiated crimes (different to incident records) with a specific offence code or free-text search of the related modus operandi (MO).

If you are not satisfied with this response or any actions taken in dealing with your request, you have the right to ask that we review your case under our internal procedure. Please note that a request for an internal review must be made within 20 working days of the response to your original request.

If you decide to request that such a review is undertaken and following this process you are still unsatisfied, you then have the right to direct your complaint to the Information Commissioner for consideration.
